

Money and me



A new resource for primary schools to help pupils learn about finance and money.



Overview

This resource has been produced by the Bank of England, TES and Beano to provide schools with an engaging set of resources to help UK primary school pupils learn about money in a real-world context. Learning about money and finance can be tricky for children, especially when it isn't embedded within the curriculum. The content in Money and me uses recognisable Beano characters and highly interactive content, including games and activities that make the topic both relatable and fun. We hope your pupils not only learn a huge amount from this resource but also that it gives them the confidence to manage money both now and in the future.



Written by experienced primary teachers, the Bank of England and Beano, these resources include:

- 12 lessons in PowerPoint format
- associated lesson plans with UK curriculum links
- downloadable worksheets and resource sheets
- videos within the PowerPoints
- a glossary of key terms
- plenary exit tickets
- games for class use.



At each lesson's core is the PowerPoint presentation which highlights learning objectives and outcomes as well as key words and the lesson detail. In addition, there are associated files to bring the lesson to life which include differentiated worksheets (challenge, more challenge and mega challenge), answer sheets, games and a glossary.

How to use the resources

Each lesson has been designed to last 45-60 minutes, depending on class size and previous knowledge. Lessons can be taught in any order within a Key Stage/phase/level -but ideally, schools would progress through the lessons, building on previous learning, as young people move through the year groups. Lesson plans guide teachers through the lessons and highlight where additional ideas or differentiation tasks can be applied. They also contain suggested timings for each activity, these are for guidance purposes only and teachers are encouraged to adapt them to reflect their individual teaching groups. Specific curriculum references are provided within lesson plans. It is also possible to integrate these lessons into wider project-based cross-curricular classwork.



Each lesson introduces new, and sometimes challenging, vocabulary for pupils which is supported by a series of tasks and a glossary is included that can be distributed for reference.



Teachers are encouraged to make use of the Plenary exit tickets to help assess learning at the end of each lesson.




